It is the harvest season in this area of north east Romania; crops are being brought in and the land prepared for the next seeding. The rural panorama shows large combine harvesters and multi-gang ploughs transforming the appearance of the commercial holdings whilst one man and his horse move slowly back and forth on an adjacent single-hectare field. At evening they both go home, the combine dominating the road whilst the horse-drawn cart humbly moves over for other traffic. But who is happier - the rich man working to pay off his debt or the poor man exhausted by his day of manual labour?

Jesus Christ spoke of a similar contrast between two representatives of the society of his time (Luke ch 16). The rich man was not condemned because he was rich but because he was selfish and refused to share the blessings that he had received. Elsewhere, Jesus described the rewards for those who help the poor and the condemnation of those who do not (Matt ch 25).

In the relatively sophisticated west the significance of harvest has become obscured by the year-round supplies in supermarkets. However, there is an upside - supermarkets have surpluses and special offers so Harvest becomes an opportunity to help yourself at the same time as helping others!
